On Friday the 18th of July The Phoenix Centre played host a community celebration to mark the completion of the first two phases of the Phoenix Project.

The project has four phases; it combines the conversion of the former dilapidated Sandwich Youth Club into a multi-purpose, environmentally sound, community facility with a dedicated youth area, designed by the young people themselves.

The first two phases were supported by Kent Rural Towns (KRT) Programme, The Phoenix Centre was the first project delivered under this funding scheme and KRT provided a substantial part of the funding for this £460k project.

In recognition of the successful completion ahead of schedule and further development of the project Sue Beer the Kent Rural Towns coordinator, presented a certificate to Phil Scott, Company Director and project manager, in the presence of Cllr Leyland Ridings, SEEDA's Malcolm Rowe, young people and other users of the centre.

Sue Beer of KRT stated: 'The Phoenix Centre is a wonderful example of how the power regeneration can change people's lives; we hope this project will inspire future groups to do what they can to make a difference in their own communities'.
